

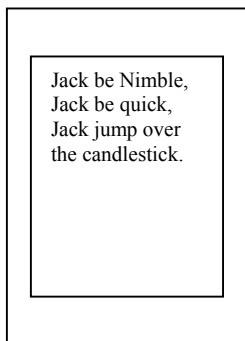
Organize A Poem!

Directions: Print all three pages, then cut apart the sentence strips. Have your child to read the poem, then arrange the strips to look like the "whole" poem (you can make this more difficult later by cutting strips apart into individual words, then helping your child to arrange the words to match the poem).

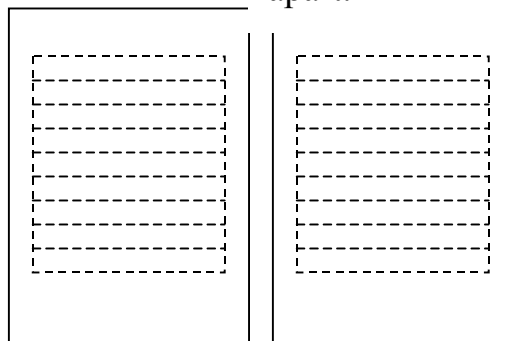
Activities: Count the letters, count the words, find the spaces, listen for and identify the rhyming words, practice pointing to each word as it is read, and notice where we go to read the next line.

Skills: Students learn that poems and stories must make sense, print is read from left to right, words make up sentences, and many poems have words that rhyme.

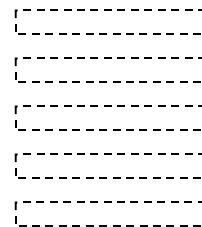
Step 1: Print pages

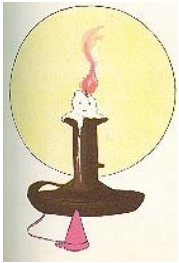


Step 2: Cut strips
